## Reward Daphne & Charles - Help & Care

Daphne and her husband Charles are in their 80s and have been helping the local community through volunteering for over 20 years. They have carried out different roles at Help & Care, including driving people with mobility problems to essential appointments or visiting older and isolated people at home and are now part of the Telephone Befriending Support Scheme.

### Reward Paul - Dreamflight

Each year, Dreamflight charters a 747 plane and takes 192 seriously ill or disabled children for a 10 day holiday of a lifetime to Orlando. On the day of the departure, all 192 children (plus over 200 medical and non-medical volunteers) are transported from the Hilton London at Heathrow Airport to the hangar set aside for Dreamflight.



Paul is the incredible volunteer who brings this whole departure/boarding experience together. It is a very stressful task, but Paul has ensured we have left on time for 30 years! He does not stop, until every person is on board and his enthusiasm does not wane for a second. The children absolutely love him and his legendary 'Who's the best Group' shouts are an integral part of the whole Dreamflight experience!

## Reward Denise - Hospitality Action

Denise is an invaluable help to Hospitality Action.

She visits grant applicants who need support with their application, hosts lunches & teas for our Golden Friends (retired industry members who are often isolated or lonely) and is a volunteer visitor. On top of this, she writes around 2,000 birthday and Christmas cards to our Golden Friends, which sadly is sometimes the only one they receive. She also helps with the posting of almost 1,500 of the Golden Friend's newsletter every two months.



She really is our hero and has made such a huge impact on so many people's lives over the years. We really couldn't do without her, she's amazing.
